

It is probable that Wright enlisted the help of Captain D.C.F. Scott as a Property Manager and it is probable that under his command, convict labourers built the original Bengalla station complex which consisted of four to five major buildings, including a homestead, barn and shearing shed, cottages, carpenter's shop, stable and coach house. Little remains of the station except a building similar to a shearing shed and the remains of a wall with brick and stone dating from c.1840. There are numerous suggestions for the possible functions of the building to which this wall belongs, including, a storehouse, a shearers cottage due to the remnants of an oven, or simply a retaining wall. The property was sold by auction in April, 1853 to Keys who was the largest landowner in the area by the 1850's and a pioneer irrigator and exporter of live cattle. Governor Fitzroy stayed at the original Bengalla homestead in 1847 during his tour of the Hunter Valley. A 1920's-30's farmhouse now stands on the site of the original homestead. Gradually the stone from the wall has been removed and taken to a vineyard in the Upper Hunter. The property has remained in the Keys family until recently when it was sold to the Bengalla Mining Company. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The site has regional historic significance for being one of the very earliest developed pastoral properties in the region. The remaining grand "shearing shed" structure is of a scale and quality of construction rare in the region and as such must be considered to have regional significance. Socially the site is of great significance to the descendants of the Keys family, but more than this, it is of state social significance for having hosted a visit of Governor Fitzroy in the mid 19th century. Scientifically the building and site are of regional significance for their potential to reveal information about the scale of operations of one of the earliest and grandest developed properties of the region in the early to mid 19th century.
