The first building on this site was opened in 1862. In 1864 the Muswellbrook Benevolent Society opened a seven bed hospital. Early Trustees of the hospital included John Hobart Cox (Negoa), John Hudson Keys (Bengalla) and James White (Edinglassie). Substantial alterations were made in response to demand in the 1880's and are attributable to John Horbury Hunt. It was used continuously as a hospital until 1914 when the hospital moved over to the Bentwood site. Offered for lease in 1915 and eventually sold in 1945 to K.W.D. Humphreys. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The building has local historic significance as Muswellbrook's first hospital. Socially the building has local significance for the descendants of families whom the hospital was an identifiable component of Muswellbrook life and also because of its latter long-term association with an eminent Muswellbrook family. Scientifically the building has great local significance essentially for its potential to reveal information which could contribute to an understanding of the delivery of health services in a country town in the mid to late 19th century.
