


The building's hospital function ended in 1923 and it has since reverted to residential use. There are two houses on the site, the older being former hospital. 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Historically the building has local significance for being the first private hospital in Denman. Aesthetically it is representative of type at the regional level. Scientifically the building is of local significance for its potential to reveal information which could contribute to an understanding of the delivery of private hospital services in a small Upper Hunter town at the start of the 20th century.
