STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE				
Historically this building has regional rarity and significance: it represents the earliest surviving evidence of a major centre for Presbyterian worship in the Upper Hunter Valley. Socially the building shares local significance with the more recent church building. Scientifically it is of regional significance for its potential to reveal information about the Presbyterian catchment in the earliest years of settlement in the Upper Hunter and its style of worship.
