STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The property is a rare, almost intact survivor of its mid-19th century period in the region and as such has regional historic significance. Aesthetically it consists of a sophisticated building design set in a carefully conceived garden consisting of up-to-the minute design elements. In this context it is of the very highest regional significance. Socially the property also has regional significance for being associated with the eminent pioneering Robertson and Pearce families. Scientifically the property is likely to be one of the most significant in the region for being able to reveal information which could contribute to an understanding of the conduct of a major mid-19th century pastoral property and of the manner in which wealthy pastoralists lived at that time.
