

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STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE <p>Historically the building must be considered of regional significance for representing two different phases of the development of the site over a fifty year period - from the very earliest evidence of the establishment of the Anglican Church in Muswellbrook. The evidence is in the re-use of the original bricks, which in itself evidences a recognition of the historical associations of the site even in the mid-19th century. Aesthetically the design is unique in the region executed by a regionally significant Architect. Thus the building has regional aesthetic significance. Socially the building has local significance for its potential to reveal information which could contribute to an understanding of the adaptive re-use of building materials in the mid-19th century.</p>
