


The item was built as a church-school to replace the original church which was erected at the river end of Palace Street in 1884. Historically the St Josephs Hall (formerly the St Bernards Catholic Church) is of local significance as it plots the establishment and growth of the Catholic Church in Denman in the early part of the 20th century. Socially it is of significance to the local Catholic community for its part in providing the place of worship locally, prior to 1980. Scientifically the building is of local significance for its potential to reveal information about the scale and features of Catholic worship from early this century in the Denman area. The Church is of a type, rare locally.
