

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Historically the building is of local significance because it represents the establishment of the Church of England in Denman. Aesthetically it is regionally significant for the uniqueness of its composition and because it is an important work in the oeuvre of the region's most significant architect of the late 19th century. Socially the building is of local significance to the parishioners of the Anglican Church in Denman, while scientifically the building is of regional significance; it has the potential to reveal information which could contribute to an understanding of the scale of resources of patrons of the church in the Upper Hunter in the late 19th century and about the size of the Anglican catchment of the time. The church has local rarity but is representative of Hunt's work at a regional level.
